#### Kit Contains

- ✓ Seat & Cover (PN 42036 or 42037)
- ✔ Closet flange seal (PN 02125)
- ✓ Instruction sheet (PN 42100)

#### Needed

- ✓ Towel(s)
- ✔ Plastic trash bag
- ✔ Flat-head screwdriver
- ✓ 1/2-inch wrench

## **Before Beginning**

- Read all instructions completely.
- Reduce holding tank odor: Rinse toilet with water, drain holding tank, and add Thetford Holding Tank Deodorant.
- Wear protective gloves, glasses, long sleeves, and nose/face mask to avoid contact with human waste.
- ✓ Wash entire toilet thoroughly.
- ✓ Refer to Figures 1 and 2 for component locations. Style Lite shown.

Note: You may not need to remove the toilet if you have adequate access to the back of toilet and Nut on underside of Bowl.

#### Remove Toilet

- Turn off RV water supply per RV Owner's Manual.
- 2. Flush toilet to drain.
- Place towel(s) behind toilet under water connection to catch water.
- 4. Disconnect RV water supply from toilet.
- Remove Closet Flange Bolt Covers (if present) and Nuts.
- 6. Lift Toilet from floor and place on trash bag.
- 7. Cover holding tank opening with a towel.
- 8. Remove old closet flange Seal. Discard.

### Remove old Seat & Cover

- 1. Flip up Hinge Caps.
- While holding Nut on underside of Bowl, use flathead screwdriver to remove Bolt from Nut and Washers. Discard.
- 3. Remove Seat & Cover. Discard.

#### Install new Seat & Cover

- Position new Washer on top of hole opening. Position Seat & Cover, placing new Bolt through hinge and Washer.
- At underside, place new Washer and Nut on Bolt. Hand tighten. Secure with screwdriver.
- 3. Lock Hinge Caps in place.

### Reinstall Toilet

- Install new Closet Flange Seal, lip side down, on toilet.
- Uncover holding tank opening and remove towel(s).
- Place Toilet on floor, aligning mounting holes with closet bolts.
- 4. Tighten Closet Flange Nuts until toilet does not rock. *Do not overtighten*.
- 5. Replace Bolt Covers (if present).
- 6. Connect RV water supply line to Toilet.
- 7. Turn on RV water supply.
- 8. Flush test Toilet, checking for leaks at all connections.

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
