

DESCRIPTION OF PROBLEM							
When air suspension is deflated and unit lowers in ride height, there is the possibility that, depending on the position of the rear mud flap, it may raise and cut through an Oasis hose and Spartan wiring to the Engine Block Heater.							
RECOMMENDED SOLUTION							
Re-route hose and wire through opening in the frame (see attached picture). This will prevent the possibility of contact between the mud flap, its bracket, and the Oasis hose and Spartan wiring.

## TSB 325 Procedure



Disconnect the lines to the Oasisi Over Flow Bottle and route them through the existing hole in the frame. Do the same with the existing Spartan Engine Block Heater wires as well.

It is IMPORTANT to line the opening in the frame rail with plastic wiring conduit cover to prevent chaffing of the wires and hoses as they pass through it and contact it.

Make certain the wiring and hoses are routed in a manner that will prevent any possible contact from the mud flap or its brackets as they move both vertically and horizontally.
